

Gordon's Tips to Perfecting your Portfolio

- 1 Know your audience. Consider who will review your portfolio and think about what matters most to them.
- 2 You may not be able to judge a book by its cover, but like it or not, the cover really matters. It's a handshake and we always remember the ones that connect. You are in the business of marketing your potential.
- 3 Portfolios are an important way to introduce and express your unique POV to the world. They should be a thoughtful and professional expression of the author.
- 4 Great portfolio does not only showcase the author's technical proficiencies but also gives the reader some insight into what inspires them and drives their passion to create.
- 5 Your cover letter should clearly state your career goals and objectives.

Jaymie's Tips to Perfecting your Portfolio

- 1 Although many interviews are now being held over Zoom, this will not always be the case. It is important to consider the layouts of each individual page, but also compositionally across the entire 2-page spread as in-person, printed portfolios are typically reviewed in this manner.
- 2 Quality over quantity. Limit the total number of images on the sheets and focus on those that best represent the work. Don't be afraid of the white space. This provides the eyes a break from stimulation and can help in the overall composition of the spreads.
- 3 Ensure clear, concise language in your descriptions. Avoid run-on sentences as it is easy for a future employer to get lost in the abundance of words and lists of items. And with that being said, don't be afraid to use the text blocks as part of the visual composition of a spread.

"Hi, My name is Mahrukh, and I work for Design Link International Inc. as a senior lead designer. I hold a Bachelor of Architecture degree from Punjab University, Pakistan. I started my career in Riyadh, Saudi Arabia as a Junior Interior Designer where I worked for 4 years on various hospitality and commercial projects. I joined the Design Link Team in October 2016. My experience allows me to overcome the challenges of interior design from concept development to the building stage. I am a natural team leader and respond greatly to the client's needs .I have worked in Hospitality Design for approximately ten years. Understanding my client's visions and getting to know them are the first steps in my creative approach."

Mahrukh's Tip for Students

"The best advice I can provide to the students is to present their portfolios with confidence, assurance and enthusiasm. A successful portfolio should showcase the individual's originality and unique skills."





Grad Spotlight

Q & A

Within this Grad Spotlight, we interview fellow graduate **Nicola Klahre** a Junior Interior Designer at **DEIL Studio**. Nicola provides her insight into the hospitality industry and advice to students embarking on their design path.



1. What attracted you to the hospitality industry?

"The hospitality industry creates such a wide range of design possibilities that arise within each project because of the complexity and scale of the interiors. It is not only the creation of a design aesthetic that interests me, but it is the spatial design as well that can transform a design concept into reality."

2. What have you discovered to be the most important aspects a design student should focus on for this industry?

"Since occupants of hospitality interiors do not stay in these spaces long term, it is important for designers to focus on user experience. The interior needs to have an immersive story for the occupant to enjoy & remember, along with the ease of use within the space."

3. What is your best source of inspiration when working on a project?

"When starting the design of a project, I enjoy taking inspiration from the project location. This helps support the local area and unify the project with the city that surrounds it. Doing this can also make a hospitality interior even more impactful as it is designed specifically for that one area with meaningful local design characteristics."

4. What do you wish you knew about when you were a student, that you have since discovered while working in the field?

"After experiencing the hospitality industry, I realize how many layers of detail get put into each project to make them so dynamic. It is important to design thoroughly, but also just as important to ensure the working drawings & specifications reflect the same level of detail to ensure the design intent is properly followed through to reality."

5. Any advice for students embarking on their career path?

"Take all opportunities that arise for you, and do not be afraid to search for your own! Put yourself out there and absorb as much knowledge as you can. This will benefit you as a growing designer."



DesignerStone® Panels Student Event

AN INSIDE LOOK INTO THE EVENT

As we emerged from the COVID cocoon this past March, NEWH Inc. Toronto, in conjunction with DesignerStone Panels, hosted a "soft" opportunity for interior design and architecture students to meet professionals from the hospitality industry. The focus of the evening was a long overdue presentation to one of two NEWH Inc Toronto scholarship recipients, Wireko(University of Toronto, Architecture).
